BMS faculty members are required to participate!

- DEI Champions or SyMS + ≥1 additional approved event every year.
- Failure to participate = no rotation students, non-renewal of membership at 3-year review

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Accountability and Education

- For students
 - Bi-directional feedback for rotation evaluations
 - New Curriculum additions:
 - GRAD202 Race and Racism in Science, starting fall 2020
 3 units, required for 1st year students
 - 3 mini-courses offered in 2021
 - DEI Leadership Training Course: elective with a service learning component and funds for project work
 - Community circles, a restorative justice initiative for community building and conflict resolution

Striving for racial justice in academic biology
